

Dear Patient and Family,

We look forward to starting your HBOT treatments at our facility. These safety measures **MUST** be followed during your course of treatment.

✓ Clothing worn in the chamber must be at least 50% cotton. Adults will be provided with scrubs. A disposable diaper may be worn but must be covered by cotton clothing. Buttons, zippers, snaps, and/or Velcro are not allowed. Alcohol and petroleum-based products should not be applied before treatments. The following may not be on the body when entering the chamber:

Jewelry or body piercingHearing aids/ear pods/headphonesChapstick/lip balmMetal glassesEarplugsChewing gumWatchDeodorantCosmetics

Dentures, partials, Invisalign Perfume Compression stockings

Synthetic hair/lashes Hairspray Heat patches
Hair accessories Oil, lotion, cream, Vaseline Medicated patches

Hard contacts Mani/pedi within 24 hours Petroleum based dressings

✓ The following may not be taken into the chamber:

Toys Wallet or purse Vape pen iPad or e-reader Any electronic device or battery E-cigarette Phone Matches Warming device

Keys Lighters Warming patches or pads

Any metal Cigarettes

Book, magazine, or paper Any flammable material

A pacifier may be taken into the chamber. You will be provided with a small water bottle.

- ✓ While we provide lockers for your belongings, it is always best to leave them at home.
- ✓ Due to the HIPAA Privacy Act, and for safety reasons, we are unable to allow family members to stay in the hyperbaric chamber room while the patient is being treated.
- ✓ Patients should not consume carbonated drinks at least one hour, if not more, prior to treatment, as it may cause stomach upset. A nutritious meal and hydration with water prior to each treatment is recommended. If the patient has a temperature of 101 degrees or higher they will not be treated. Stop or decrease any nicotine use during the course of treatment, as nicotine works against oxygen therapy.
- ✓ Inform the technician of any new medications, diagnoses, or symptoms before each daily treatment. If the patient is diabetic remember to take a blood glucose reading immediately prior to and after each treatment and inform the technician of the results.
- ✓ The patient will need to equalize their ears early and often in the chamber. Breathe normally and always communicate with the technician about how you are feeling.
